Service of Union of East Fife Rural and Linkage with Ceres, Kemback and Springfield

On Sunday 1st March, Presbytery met to celebrate the union of Carnbee, Kilrenny, Kingsbarns, and Largoward, who joined together as the new united charge of East Fife Rural.

Following this, the formal linkage of East Fife Rural with Ceres, Kemback and Springfield Church was enacted. Rev Jane Barron was also introduced as the first minister of the new charge.

The sermon was preached by Eileen Miller, discussing the first disciples leaving their boats for Jesus, while Rev Michael Allardice led the congregation in the statement of Christian Faith.

Presbytery Clerk Rev Alec Shuttleworth read the narrative and acting Presbytery Moderator Rev Brian Porteous formally united the East Fife Rural and then linked the congregation with Ceres, Kemback and Springfield.

It was a very busy service, with standing room only, as the congregations gathered from across this rural area of Fife, sharing the love of Christ together with refreshments after the service giving people the opportunity to share in fellowship together and welcome Jane.

Our prayers are with these congregations as they take their first steps in this new chapter. May Christ be at their side over the followings months ahead.

New Principal Clerk Announced

The Church of Scotland has announced Rev Dr Alistair May as the next Principal Clerk to the General Assembly.

The appointment will be confirmed at this year's General Assembly and will require Dr May to take an oath of office in front of commissioners. He will take up the role, which has been held by 40 people since the 16th century, at the end of proceedings. The Acting Principal Clerk, Rev Dr John McPake, will clerk the upcoming General Assembly before stepping down.



Dr May has been a parish minister for 24 years and currently serves the congregation of Motherwell: Kirk at the Cross. Prior to this he was at Rutherglen: Stonelaw Church. Dr May has held offices in different parts of the Church including as Vice-Convener of Legal Questions, a member of the Presbytery Partnership Support Programme Group and as Convener of the Presbytery Planning Group in Forth Valley and Clydesdale.

Having originally gained a Law degree, he carried out further studies in theology followed later on by a PhD on the New Testament, and he has a particular interest in ecumenical and doctrinal issues.

Dr May said it was both "an honour" and "daunting" to serve the Church in this new ministry. "It will certainly be a huge wrench not to be ministering locally in a parish, which I have found to be a deeply fulfilling vocation over the last 24 years, but I see this as an exciting calling to continue to serve local churches in a new way," he added.

The role of the Principal Clerk is to act as the Clerk to the General Assembly, which includes advising the Assembly and the Moderator on church law, practice and procedure. They also support the Moderator of the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland throughout the year as well as providing training courses and advice on church law and procedures to Kirk Sessions, Presbyteries, ministers and other church bodies.

Triona is one of the authors of a new book: 'Belonging without Barriers', a much-needed resource on disability inclusion as a gospel issue, due out on 20 March 2026.

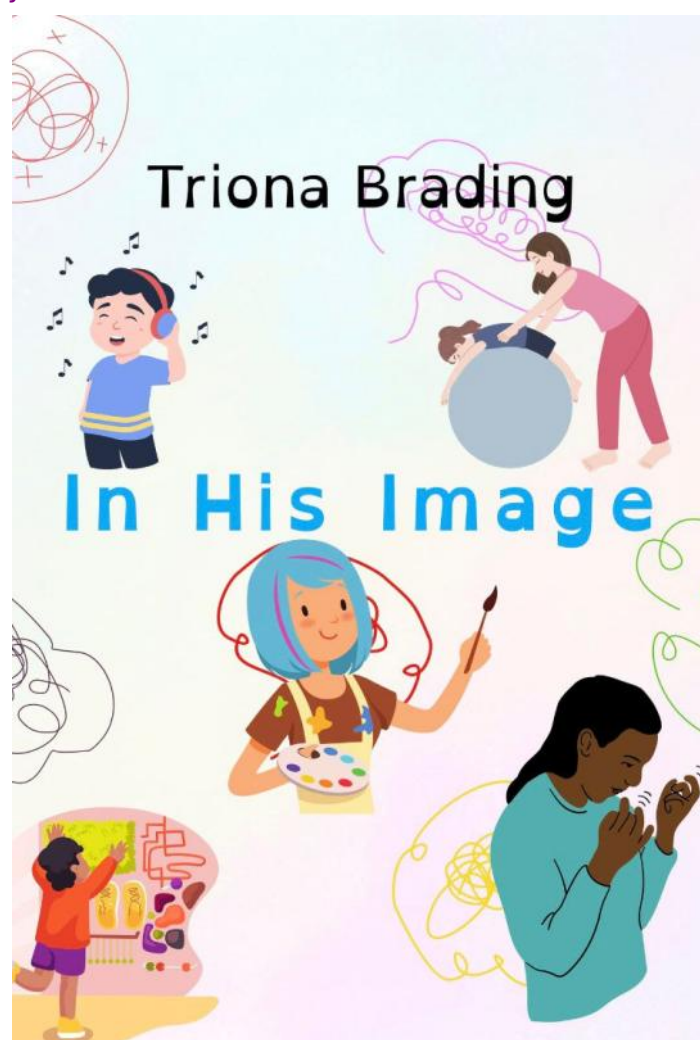
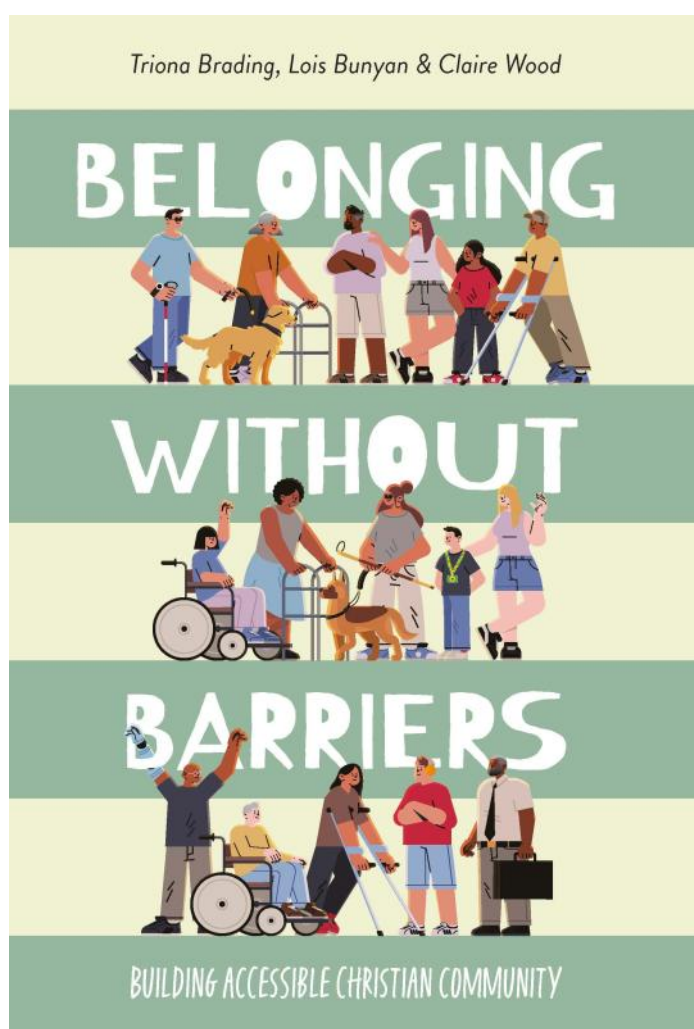
Also by Triona Brading is 'In His Image', a colourful children's book on what it means to be neurodivergent.

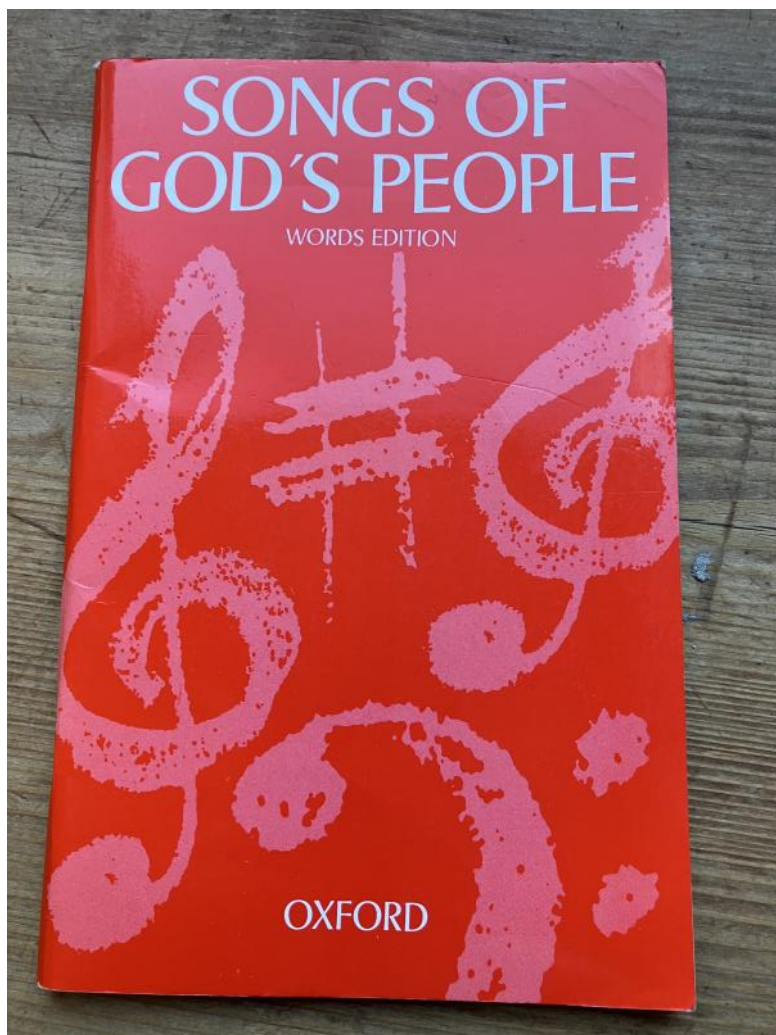

Urgent Action Briefing - Listed Places of Worship Grant Scheme

In late January 2026, the UK Government announced the closure of the Listed Places of Worship Grant Scheme, which had allowed VAT to be reclaimed on repairs to listed places of worship, at the end of March 2026.

This announcement was unexpected and will impact current projects as well as ending a scheme which has been vital over many years, and without it will add further financial burdens to Congregations and the Church as a whole.

If you are a Presbytery Clerk or writing as a convener or member of a presbytery committee with a remit for property and finance, you should write to all the MPs whose constituency falls within the bounds of the presbytery.

How to contact your MP:

Enter your postcode (or the postcode of your church building) into the Find your MP search bar at the top of this page: <https://members.parliament.uk/>. On your MP's page, you will find their email address.

What to say:

Share the surprise that the Listed Places of Worship Grant Scheme is being closed and disappointment that the Church of Scotland was not consulted or informed about this decision.

Talk about the listed churches that are part of your congregation – their history and the role they play in the community (including social action/outreach work that takes place, such as hosting community organisations, collections for foodbanks, friendship/social activities, school outreach, climate, refugee, or interfaith work etc.)

If you have a current or recent repair project and have benefited from the Listed Places of Worship Grant Scheme, tell them this and what it has meant to your congregation.

Recognise that the Church of Scotland has recently had to sell many historic and beloved buildings because we can't afford to keep and run them. The likelihood is that this decision will make further disposals happen sooner.

Point out that a new fund is for England only; but that the UK Government appears not to have liaised or consulted with the Scottish (or Welsh or Northern Ireland) Government about this.

Invite the MP to visit your church to see the building and learn about some of the community and spiritual work which takes place.

Follow up:

If you have written to your MP and have not received a response after five working days, follow up. MPs receive hundreds of messages a day, alongside parliamentary and political party commitments – they may need a friendly nudge to make sure that the issue has been drawn to their attention.
